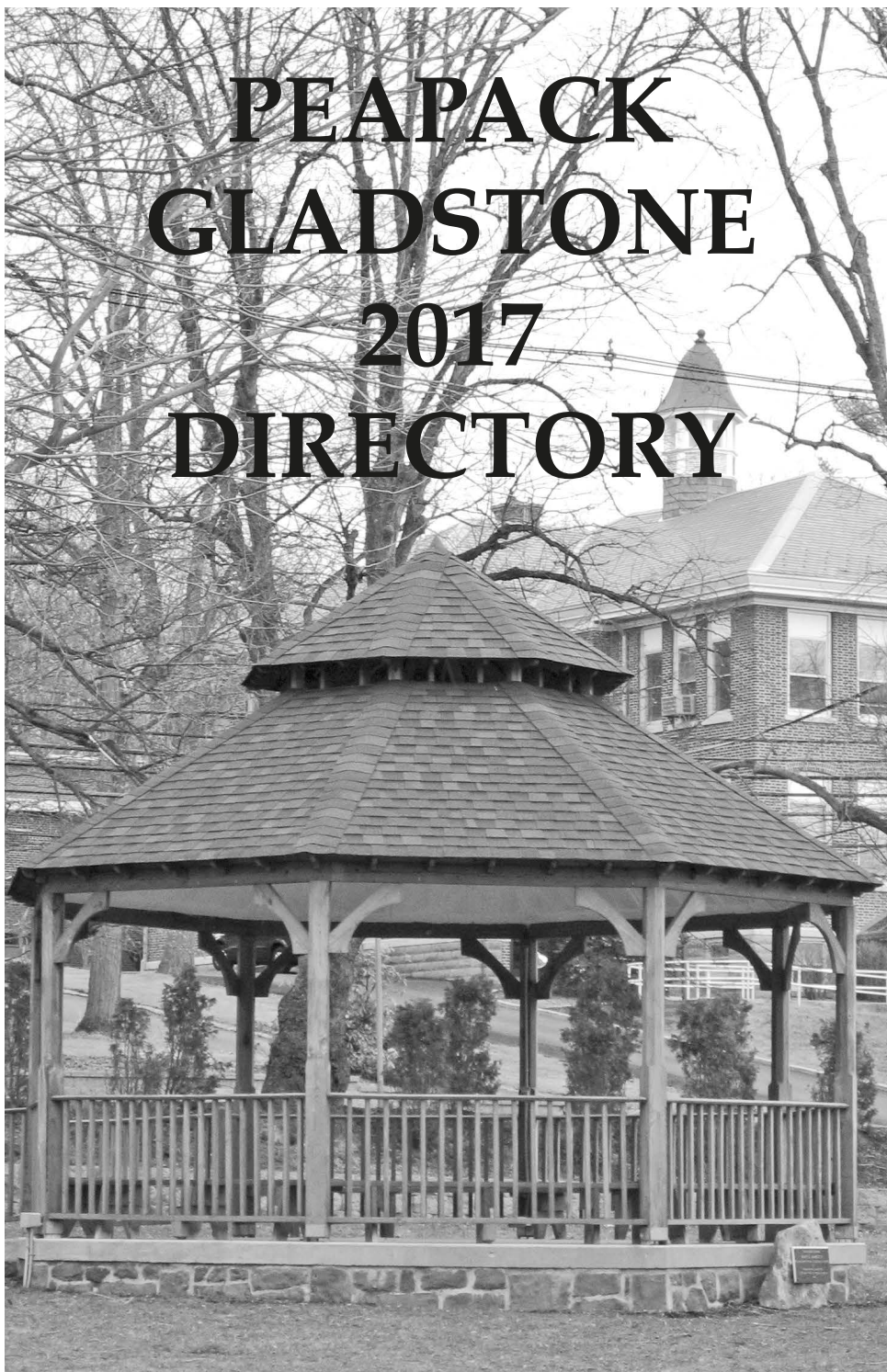


# PEAPACK GLADSTONE 2017 DIRECTORY

## WELCOME TO PEAPACK & GLADSTONE

The Borough of Peapack & Gladstone, consisting of two villages joined in 1912, was originally part of Bedminster Township. It is home to slightly more than 2,580 residents and is a leafy green, historic town nestled in a quiet eddy of the beautiful hills of northern Somerset County. It is blessed with historic homes, spectacular vistas and pristine trout streams. It has retained its small town environment, and its very people friendly services and shops. It has also retained its rural atmosphere, and continues its very successful efforts to preserve its magnificent open spaces, farms and wooded hills. It is within easy access to New York City by rail and major highways, and is a highly desirable residential community.

The Borough has long been home to horse farms and those interested in equestrian pursuits, and boasts the Essex Hunt Club and Fox Hounds, and the U.S. Equestrian Stables nearby at Hamilton Farms - also home to a premier golf course. Its woodlands abound with pheasants, wild turkeys, foxes and songbirds. It has retained its night sky, and monitors and enhances its environmental resources carefully to protect its wetlands, forests and wildlife. It has superb restaurants and beautiful parks, including Natirar, a magnificent 500+ acre estate purchased for open space by Somerset County, and previously owned by the King of Morocco.

The Borough also retains an abundance of other great and historic estates, such as Blairsden, all of whose owners have been great stewards of the land for many generations. It is home to Pfizer, which is situated in a bucolic office campus, and is also home to long time business residents such as the Komline Sanderson Corporation and Peapack & Gladstone Bank, the oldest independent bank in Somerset County. It is also home to the renowned Matheny Medical and Educational Center.

Finally, the Borough is a town blessed with great schools and cultural events, such as its Art in the Park and Community Day, and has a strong sense of community. Its residents often enjoy the quiet of the pond in Liberty Park, and the swans which make their home there. It is also fortunate to have a wide array of volunteers, such as the members of the Fire Department and First Aid and Rescue Squad, who devote their time, talent and experience to ensure that the Borough remains a great place to raise a family, and to retire, in a small town environment. Not surprisingly, it has been named by New Jersey Monthly as the second best place to live in New Jersey.

Come visit our shops and restaurants and walk our tree shaded sidewalks and parks. You will go home relaxed, happy and well fed, and planning your next visit.

## **THE BOROUGH FORM OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT**

The Borough form of municipal government in New Jersey is a classic “weak mayor-strong council” plan. The Borough form was first created by the Borough Act of 1878. The Borough form of government is currently contained in N.J.S.A. 40A:60-1 et seq. (PL 1987, c 379; otherwise known as the Borough Act of 1987). As of January 1, 1995 there were 218 Borough forms in New Jersey. The Borough form is the largest single form of municipal government in use in New Jersey today.

The Mayor is elected at large and serves a term of four years. The Borough Council consists of six members elected at large, who serve a term of three years. Their terms are arranged so that the terms of two Council members shall expire at the end of each year.

The Peapack & Gladstone Volunteer Fire Company has been serving the community since 1905. In addition to monthly business meetings, the company conducts monthly drills to maintain skills in fire fighting.

Community services provided include 24 hour fire protection and a variety of projects such as the annual Easter Egg Hunt, Memorial Day services, Boy Scout activities and Fire Prevention Week events in October. During Fire Prevention Week an open house is held at the Firehouse with films, literature and fire engine tours.

The Peapack & Gladstone Fire Company also sponsors a Junior Firemen's Auxiliary. Young residents of the Borough ages 16 through 18 may join and learn the ropes of becoming a regular member. **THE PEAPACK & GLADSTONE LIBRARY**

The Peapack & Gladstone Library is a branch of the Somerset County Library system and offers borrowing privileges to all who live, work, own property or go to school in the Borough. In addition to offering a collection of over 30,000 books, books on CD, video games (Wii, PS3, Xbox360), DVDs, music CDs, magazines, newspapers and maps, the Library also provides access to downloadable music and DVDs through its website <http://www.somerset.lib.nj.us/peapackgladstone.htm>. The Library offers public use of various equipment in-house such as fax machine, photocopier and internet access. Other equipment available for loan include an overhead projector and movie screens.

Historically, in 1936 the library was transferred from the custody of the Rev. J.J. Harper of St. Luke's Church to the Peapack and Gladstone Woman's Club under whose able direction it prospered and grew until it became a branch of the County system in 1982. On March 15, 1983 the library was moved from its home by Liberty Park, which it had occupied since 1936, to the Municipal Complex.

The Library enjoys generous assistance from volunteers.





**Branches, limbs, twigs and shrubs/brush will no longer be picked up by the garbage hauler. Residents must arrange for private pick up or make use of a mulch pile in their backyard.**

**BULK COLLECTION CLEAN UP DAYS** collection service shall be on the **FIRST WEDNESDAY** of **FEBRUARY, MAY, AUGUST AND NOVEMBER ONLY**. Please **NO TIRES, CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, RECYCLING, HAZARDOUS WASTE OR YARD WASTE**. Questions, call 234-2250 X 100.

It is the responsibility of all property owners to notify their tenants of the garbage, bulk refuse and recycling pick-up schedules. If you have any complaints or problems concerning this service contact the Borough Clerk's Office at 908-234-2250 X 100. For all other health related problems call Lucy Forgione, the Board of Health Officer at 908-204-3070.

## RECYCLING

Mandatory recycling is required for aluminum cans, glass, newspapers, magazines, cardboard, tin cans, bi-metal cans, household batteries, and plastic bottles. Refer to the Somerset County issued recycling schedule and pamphlet for additional information or call 732-469-3363.

Newspapers and cardboard (cut in 2 foot squares) **MUST BE TIED AND BUNDLED.**

**CHIPBOARD** - boxes from cereal, crackers, etc. should be tied with the corrugated cardboard for pick up.

Magazines and junk mail must be placed in brown paper grocery bags.

**BUTTON CELL BATTERIES (HEARING AIDS, ETC.) MUST BE DISPOSED OF ON HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF DAYS (CALL 908-234-2250 X 100 FOR DATES.)**

**RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES MUST BE RECYCLED.** They can be dropped off at local retailers such as Radio Shack, Target, Staples, Office Max, Lowes, Home Depot, Sears, Walmart and Verizon Wireless. You may also recycle rechargeable batteries on the first Saturday of the month at the Somerset County Recycling Center in Bridgewater. Call 732-469-3363 for information and directions.
