The Council would like to remove these designations and they are appealing. There will be a special Council meeting in September to have CVD present to the public and ask for input. CVD is moving forward with a plan. The EPA appeal is not slowing them down. Tamke Tree is coming on site to check out ash tree concerning bores. If bores are attacking the trees, the have to come down. CVD is working the water quality with Princeton Hydro in parallel. Mike stated that underground spring feeds into the pond.
