#### 7. VISITORS:

A. Jason Capizzi-Waters, Mc Pherson, Mc Neill PC & Treasurer Robinson

Mr. Capizzi spoke about the requirements to do a refunding bond. Stated that the Borough may do one (1) advanced refunding which is any refunding 90 days prior to the call day which is 2019 for these bonds. The increase in interest rates necessitates refunding. Local Finance Board approval not required for bonds with a greater than 3% savings. The bonds would be locked for 10 years and would be at an adjustable rate. Net savings would be \$109, 083 with a cost of issuance of \$75,000. Mr. Capizzi stated that he could not give financial advice and that the Borough would need to hire a financial advisor in accordance with Local Finance Notice 2014-9.

Council requested that the Borough Administrator reach out to other underwriters and/or brokers regarding the refunding. The matter has been tabled until further information is received.






