7. VISITORS:

A. Somerset County Prosecutor – Rapid Program, Chief Greg Skinner

Sgt. Warner Rodas and Patrolman/Detective Duff explained the registration process, which requires dealers to register sellers of goods as defined in the ordinance. This ordinance was piggy backed from Delaware and Maryland law. Currently 4 ways to report sales and purchases of precious goods currently in the County. State of New Jersey not providing any assistance. Create efficiency where it is lacking. 5 towns in Somerset County are currently in process of implementing program.

Council expressed a general concern for the ordinance.





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Councilman Simpson asked about trading of coins; Sgt. Warner stated that activity would be exempt. Councilman Smith pointed out that statement is contrary to the draft ordinance which included trading. Councilman Suriano asked why the State is not taking the lead if the centralized reporting system is required, and that there is a State statute requiring the reporting. Sgt. Warner pointed out that the State Police have been trying to get a centralized reporting system, but the Governor's Office has not been inclined to advance a State measure. Councilman Caminiti commented that this was a very broad net being cast and maybe needs to be tightened.

Natalie Hrybowych was asked to speak since she runs the consignment shop in the Borough, and expressed concern about the over-reaching aspects of the ordinance as drafted.
