7. PUBLIC COMMENTS: 5 MINUTES PER PERSON - NON-AGENDA ITEMS

It is the policy of the Borough Council that all public comments on an issue shall be limited to five (5) minutes per person. Comments may be made on any Non-Agenda subject pertaining to Borough issues. Comments pertaining to Public Hearings should be saved for that section of the agenda. No debating between residents. Comments should be addressed to Mayor and Council at the public microphone

Christopher Downing, Main Street, raised the issue of the striping of Main Street, done by Somerset County, and the fact that the one narrow lane is a problem. The Gran Fondo bicycle race this past weekend and additional vehicles in town caused a dangerous situation, he opined. Somerset County had stated that re-striping the road would be done at the Borough's expense if that is what is decided. Councilman Suriano suggested that the Roads Committee determine what the cost of re-striping would be.

Police Chief Skinner informed those present that Main Street was paved in April and the Council concurred with the County, that in order to have parking along Main Street, the narrow lane on one side was the only way it could be accomplished. Discussion continued and the conclusion was that the Roads Committee would pursue pricing of the re-striping. In addition, Council requested polling the businesses and St Brigid's Church on Main Street as to whether elimination of parking on that side of the street would be detrimental to their functioning as a business or religious facility.

Garvin Walsh, Patriot Road, spoke on behalf of the Liberty Park Association. He stated that in a meeting with the State DEP, no directives or restrictions were placed regarding the pond as a wetlands area. They were agreeable, and willing to facilitate any applications necessary to move the project forward. Mr. Walsh reported that proposals from seven landscape firms will be forthcoming, by October 14th, for review.

Councilman Suriano asked Administrator Gregory if the process detailed above is similar to steps that he has taken regarding the pond. The answer was yes, so Mr. Suriano commented that this dual process is going to create confusion if one group is not aware of what the other is doing. He added that he would like to see the Property Committee take the lead on this project and come back to the Council with a progress report.

Councilman Suriano made a motion, seconded by Councilman Simpson, that the Property Committee should take control of discussions regarding the disposition of the Liberty Park pond. The motion was seconded and Council concurred. Councilman Simpson will endeavor to bolster communications between the LPA and the Council.

John Kappler, Holland Avenue, shared that the Environmental Commission's opinion is that the dam is an impediment to the stream. The weir should be removed or reconfigured into rapids so that fish can migrate. A letter could be sent to the DEP by the Commission advising that there is a water quality issue, caused by NJ Transit abandoning a weir, and ask for direction.

Attorney Bruder reviewed case law regarding DEP and municipalities and where responsibility lies in such cases, particularly financial responsibility. There are very few cases to review, and at this time, the four cases are currently on appeal. In approaching the DEP in this regard, the Borough could risk liability. Working with NJ

Transit, independent of DEP on this issue would not incur liability. Mayor Muller stated that no letter should be sent to the DEP by the Environmental Commission prior to Mr. Bruder's review.

John Skinner, Pottersville Road, asked if any other decisions have been made regarding the pond. Councilman Simpson advised that there was a decision to repair the concrete steps in order to alleviate flooding on the path. Councilman Smith added that an engineering design for the well was approved.

A. Resolution 115-2016, Award Contract Mosle Rd – discussion in retrospect of Transportation Trust Fund (TTF)

Mayor asks the Administrator to review the issue and the discussion topic Bidders agreed to extend

Gary Bossert, Mosle Road asked what the delay is in paving Mosle Road. Administrator Gregory stated that since the TTF has been frozen, no monies are available to complete road projects. The three low bidders were contacted and have agreed to extend their bids for an additional sixty days, thereby extending the date to award a contract to November 11, 2016. Should the TTF remain frozen at that point, the bids must be rejected and the Borough would need to go out to bid once the fund is reopened. All three bidders are aware of this stipulation and understand that no award can be made if the TTF remains frozen. Current work on Mosle Road is through Borough Public Works and is repair and maintenance only.

Mayor Muller indicated that the Borough will probably need to rebid the project after the TTF is reopened, and to start the \$209,000 project beforehand would risk not receiving the grant monies from the State. Administrator Gregory said that this discussion and resolution should be tabled to the November 22nd meeting.

13. MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor to ask if Council would like to make comments

Councilman Simpson stated that several complaints regarding the Gran Fondo bicycle race this past weekend were brought to his attention. Sited were the traffic problems, the number of cyclists and the interruption of the 9/11 ceremony. Park Avenue was blocked, so residents could not reach the park for the ceremony. Chief Skinner clarified, stating that the Council was not asked for permission to come through the Borough for the race, as the cyclists parked and started the race at Beval Saddlery's parking lot. Since that is private property, the event organizers do not need the Borough's permission.

Councilman Suriano reported that just received is the Borough Planner's proposal to update the 2011 Open Space and Recreation plan, and there is a recreation component in the plan. This is something that the Open Space Advisory Committee (OSAC) has expressed an interest in and requested that a committee be appointed to review the plan. Mr. Gregory agreed to place a discussion of the plan on the agenda for the September 27th Council meeting.

Councilman Lemma introduced Fire Chief John McDermott, who advised Council that the Rescue 51 vehicle needs transmission repairs. The Chief also explained that the Fire Company attends the Boonton Parade each year, and all equipment and vehicles are repaired and cleaned prior to the event. Engines 2 & 3 received 1st Place awards in their categories, Engine 3 took Best Appearing Engine in all categories, while color guard and marching took 2nd Place awards. The Rescue 51 vehicle will have the transmission repairs and be back on the road by next week.

The 9/11 Memorial Service was attended by upwards of 100 people and was very well received.
