11. MISCELLANEOUS DISCUSSION

A. Continuation of Property Maintenance Ordinance Discussion

Councilman Lemma provided a summary of the Property Maintenance Code. The BOCA (Building Officials Code Administrators) code was used to determine properties in the Borough which are "blighted:" This status indicates that, for example, a property may not have potable water, could have grass and weeds which have grown unchecked, (over 8 inches in height) or furniture on the front lawn, to site a few problems. Such situations would have a negative impact on property values to the home itself as well as the properties of the neighbors. A property maintenance ordinance would allow the Zoning Officer to monitor properties, to inform the landlord or property owner that the property is in violation, and to take steps to follow up on remediation.

Councilman Smith asked whether other towns are utilizing such ordinances, and Councilman Lemma explained that the ordinance introduced at this meeting was modelled after those from surrounding towns.

Councilman Simpson is very much opposed to this ordinance as it is currently written, as he feels that it is government overstepping its bounds. He is not opposed to landlords or absentee landlords who allow their properties to deteriorate being subject to certain consequences through an ordinance. He is not in favor of residential property owners being subject to the restrictions imposed by an ordinance as it could lead to an antagonistic situation between neighbors.

Administrator's Report:

Meeting with PSEG regarding the extension of natural gas on Willow, Tainter, and Prospect at an estimated cost of \$503,430 and down Holland and include Maple for an estimated \$284,066. Deposits would be required and would vary depending on how many people sign up for service but the minimum would be \$1,245.00 and \$1,629.00 respectively. We received a check from Green Acres for \$550,000 for the Komline Property. Budget has been sent down to the State for review. We survived the snow storm with little or no issues; However, the Administrator will need to have a conversation with Attorney Bruder about getting our money back from Summit Capital as they refuse to acknowledge responsibility for maintenance of Rockabye Valley and Blue Heron roads. We have started to receive RCO applications and fees, which has already reaped some benefits as we are receiving questions about rental that may not have had a zoning change application processed, but I caution we are still investigating the issue. Finally, please keep Donna Bassman my Deputy in your thoughts as he mother passed away over the weekend. Four of us from the office went up to pay our respects today. A thank you note has been received from Donna for the flowers which were sent to the family.

John Kappler, Environment Commission Chair, Holland Avenue, expressed concern that the Property Maintenance Ordinance was introduced without any input from the Environmental Commission or other boards. Ground cover growing to 8" could cause erosion and washout from streams. Councilman Lemma stated that ground cover is not involved, just grass becoming overgrown, and Mr. Kappler said that is not how the ordinance reads. In addition, the ordinance excludes the RR3 and RR5 zones, indicating that there would be no control of overgrown properties in those areas. Mr. Kappler stated that the ordinance should have been distributed to other departments for review. As it is written now, the Environmental Commission would have major objections.

Steve Kinsey, Mosle Road, explained that the "PG Notify" system used by the Borough to disseminate information to residents only reaches 95 or so residents. "Nextdoor", a neighborhood newsfeed, has 500 households with 800 residents as members. A municipality can set up a separate account to notify residents of noteworthy information and news items, and the responses would go only to the municipality and not to the full membership. Mr. Kinsey indicated that "Nextdoor" is used nationwide including use by police departments, fire companies, and in communities as large as Houston, Texas. He recommended that the Borough consider using "Nextdoor" as a more efficient way to reach a broader audience.
