## 6. VISITORS OR PRESENTATIONS

A. Rob Walton – JCP&L Capital budget plan, LED street lamp conversion. Pick a neighborhood with 12 to 20(12 light minimum) lights to switch over to LED which are more economical to operate, especially as the wattage of the bulbs increase. Councilman Smith asked whether the Green Team can take a look into the LED proposal. Green team response in 3 months. No cost for bulb exchange for a dead bulb.

Actual meeting may contain discussion of items not mentioned on the agenda and alternatively any items specifically listed may be omitted.

Concerning tree trimming or removal, the resident would be contacted at their door. If the resident is not at home a "door hanger" would be left, and tree will not be removed until the resident signs for approval. The tree trunk is left behind for residents to use as firewood or to discard. Stumps are not removed.

Peggy Mc Farland, Mendham Road, Gladstone, what do the lights look like, does the Borough get to choose? There is only one type of bulb, which is whiter and brighter that the bulbs currently in use, Mr. Walton responded.

Joanne Iseman, Brook Hollow, Gladstone, there is a NY Times article regarding the controversy over the introduction of LED lights in cities in Europe and there is a stunning difference. People are not pleased with the LED lighting and Ms. Iseman agreed to email the article to Councilman.

Jean Nolan, why is there only one choice? Mr. Walton responded that JCP&L does not offer a variety, but towns may purchase lights which they feel will be more pleasing, and they would be installed instead.

**<u>B.</u>** Viridian – Liberty Park Pond - Tavis Dockwiller and Brian Buchholtz presenting history of the company, Power Point presentation.

Varied water features, historic restoration work, technical requirements to water features. Communication with the maintenance department is important, as they would be maintaining the landscaping. Moving people through space, duck pond self-contained system but high waste load.

How it relates to the Borough, data gathering, opinion from fact, brain storming, alternatives, use of the park, compare to budget, final concept or with a phase in plan.

Questions:

Councilman Simpson change size and shape, can you do either, regulations permitting, difficult to answer, lot of regulation, Princeton Hydro, system in place, go all the way through to get an answer. NJDEP meeting to comment regarding the pond.

Councilman Smith - water quality, 2 algae types, excess phosphorus. Well issues, testing phosphorus to determine water quality. Brian -Water will probably need to be added, ways to pretreat.

Mayor Muller - time frame for public, Tavis -2 meetings, one with experts, 2 to 3 meetings, perhaps a 2 month time period.

Councilman Corigliano - kick off meeting, client meeting, stakeholder meeting, Municipal parks, contract with Philadelphia, universities.

Councilman Caminiti - master plan elements and incorporate those issues. Washington's Crossing on Delaware PA side, increased visitors.

Mayor - engineers on staff, Tavis - no, but friends who are engineers, worked on many projects. Councilman Suriano - size of project small or large. Very comfortable with this size project. No budget yet; thoughts on the park- Tavis, nice but could be interesting and make a very attractive park.

Mayor - details of maintenance, how big. Brian - Constructed wetlands, filtration system. Councilman Suriano - slides showed three pond slides, fountain discussion. Tavis would need to have a discussion.

Councilman Smith - Prep comment, explained to public. Contract restrictions, Kids cutting lawns would not be a contractor so not restricted. Police enforcement Contractors need to understand rules, most contractors abuse, late work.

## Questions from the Public:

John Sweeny, Farm Cottage Rd, legal issue – Contractor detrimental, why more detrimental if the homeowner does the work? Maplewood suit. Way it's written excludes homeowners Concerned that it will be discriminatory and could lead to litigation. Homeowners need to be held to the same standard. Ordinance is nonsensical, prohibited hours, homeowners can work at any time the way the ordinance is written.

Councilman Smith – reviewed with Board of Health Mayor responded, would eliminate first exception solve ordinance? Councilman Simpson issue with contractors not making living. Councilman Smith – rights as homeowners Councilman Caminiti case law, any local cases? No, just a possibility of litigation. John Sweeney gave Noise Case to Attorney Bruder. Councilman Suriano and Attorney Bruder regarding legal opinion. No change for homeowner past, present, future. Valid point that litigation can ensue, and is the threat of litigation enough to give us pause. Contractor could challenge but it would be in municipal court. Councilman Suriano, so there is no real issue. Not at this time, Mr. Bruder responded. Councilman Lemma – if need be, amend the ordinance if a portion struck down. Councilman Suriano, risk v benefit analysis

Ken Tiger, Mosle Road – think about home owners issue and concern for homeowner's rights, and does not go far enough to restrict homeowners from causing a disturbance. Councilman Suriano – ordinance should cover Contractors and Homeowners? How do you feel about government telling a homeowner what to do. Councilman Corigliano – Are there hours in the UCC? Councilman Suriano - exemption to homeowners regarding hours of work.

Jean Nolan, Hunt Lane - Gill St Bernards noise and disturbance during use of the fields. No non-school conditional uses. Saturday and Sunday activity that is disturbing. Councilman Simpson intent to expand the ordinance Councilman Smith spoke to Zoning Official and Jim Fania will speak to Gill regarding their limitations.

Councilman Lemma - to have Mr. Fania to do a in depth review, copy to Ms. Nolan.

Joan Iseman Brook Hollow – Consideration of neighbors, litigate if necessary. Add to include homeowners.

Councilman Simpson - has a problem with anybody creating laws requiring people doing things.

Peggy McFarland – do we need a law for everything? Agrees with Councilman Simpson, not in favor of ordinance. Is there any data to support the ordinance?

#### Questions from Council

Councilman Suriano to Councilman Smith - is there a compelling interest to move forward. Councilman Suriano is there an issue with contractors? Councilman Smith, yes, he has seen the contractors.

Councilman Corigliano - Police Department does get noise complaints.

Councilmen Suriano and Smith - it is compelling and needed. Narrow and effective.

Councilman Lemma surrounding municipalities have the ordinance. If we do not act, the contractors will be coming to the Borough, nights and Sundays, because they can.

Councilman Simpson - will benefit from this ordinance, but still have reservations. Elliot Dietrich exclusion; neighbor who will come to mow my lawn while I am recuperating from back surgery, is he restricted from mowing my lawn on nights and Sundays? Councilman Corigliano, Elliot is not a contractor.

Councilman Corigliano made a motion to table this ordinance,  $2^{nd}$  Councilman Caminiti,  $2^{nd}$ . All in favor.

## A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 48 (N.J.S.A. 52:14.17.38) UNDER WHICH A PUBLIC EMPLOYER MAY AGREE TO PAY FOR THE STATE HEALTH BENEFITS PROGRAM (SHBP) AND/OR SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' HEALTH BENEFITS PROGRAM (SEHBP) COVERAGE OF CERTAIN RETIREES.

#### **BE IT RESOLVED:**

1. The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Peapack & Gladstone SHBP ID NUMBER 018800 hereby elects to adopt the provisions of N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.38 and adhere to the rules and regulations promulgated by the State Health Benefits Commission to implement the provisions of that law.

2. This resolution affects employees as shown on the attached Chapter 48 Resolution Addendum. It is effective on the 1st day of April, 2017

3. We are aware that adoption of this resolution does not free us of the obligation to pay for postretirement medical benefits of retirees or employees who qualified for those payments under any *Chapter 88 Resolution* or *Chapter 48 Resolution* adopted previously by this governing body.

4. We agree that this *Resolution* will remain in effect until properly amended or revoked with the SHBP. We recognize that, while we remain in the SHBP, we are responsible for providing the payment for post-retirement medical coverage as listed in the attached *Chapter 48 Resolution Addendum* for all employees who qualify for this coverage while this *Resolution* is in force.

5. We understand that we are required to provide the Division of Pensions and Benefits complete copies of all contracts, ordinances, and resolutions that detail post-retirement medical payment obligations we undertake. We also recognize that we may be required to provide the Division with information needed to carry out the terms of this *Resolution*.

6. Elected officials and part-time employees shall not be eligible for post-retirement health benefits.

2. This resolution affects employees as shown on the attached Chapter 48 Resolution Addendum New Hires. It is effective on the 1st day of April, 2017

3. We are aware that adoption of this resolution does not free us of the obligation to pay for postretirement medical benefits of retirees or employees who qualified for those payments under any *Chapter 88 Resolution* or *Chapter 48 Resolution* adopted previously by this governing body.

4. We agree that this *Resolution* will remain in effect until properly amended or revoked with the SHBP. We recognize that, while we remain in the SHBP, we are responsible for providing the payment for post-retirement medical coverage as listed in the attached *Chapter 48 Resolution Addendum* for all employees who qualify for this coverage while this *Resolution* is in force.

5. We understand that we are required to provide the Division of Pensions and Benefits complete copies of all contracts, ordinances, and resolutions that detail post-retirement medical payment obligations we undertake. We also recognize that we may be required to provide the Division with information needed to carry out the terms of this *Resolution*.

6. Employees hired after April 1, 2017 shall not be eligible for post-retirement health benefits.
