9. OLD BUSINESS

Cm. Simpson opened a discussion regarding the three landscape architecture firms, Carter Van Dyke, Bosenberg, and Viridian, each of whom made presentations to the Council for the Liberty Park project. A lengthy discussion ensued in which the Mayor and Council members rated each firm in order of preference. The outcome was that Carter Van Dyke was favored and contact would be made. Monies would be partially provided from the Open Space Fund, and it is hoped that a grant award will be received in June. Corporate donations and bonding are also possibilities.

Mary Robinson, Borough CFO, stated that as the Borough presently does not have a Qualified Purchasing Agent (QPA), the bid threshold is now lowered As a result, there will be a delay in starting the project until monies can be accessed.

10. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Peggy McFarland, Mendham Road, stated that in order to have a park and pond for four seasons, she feels that the Borough should clear the walks in the snow season so that people can walk in the winter.

John Sweeney, Farm Cottage Road, stated that Open Space monies are dedicated to repayment of the Komline obligations and should not be heavily relied upon for financing the Liberty Park renovation.

Garvin Walsh, Gladstone, urged the Council to look to the chosen architectural firm to provide a master plan for the park and implement different phases over time. Providing a specific dollar amount to the project would be limiting the scope of the plan by the quoted figure. Mr. Walsh added that the first thing necessary in the park project is a survey, and the cost would range from \$6,500-\$7,000.

John Kappler, Chair of the Environmental Commission, also stresses the importance of working in phases on the park project. This would allow for "shovel ready" grant submissions for projects that are planned ahead. Grant projects must be ready for review at the time the grant application is made or the funds would go to other municipalities.

13. MISCELLANEOUS DISCUSSION

Councilman Suriano advised the Council that the Open Space Advisory Committee would like to have Beth Davisson, NJ Conservation Foundation, prepare a spreadsheet of all of the grant monies for which the Borough would be eligible to apply. The cost would be for four hours of work at \$105 or \$125 per hour. Council consensus was to contract Ms. Davisson to provide the grant information.

14. COUNCIL REPORTS

Finance - budget report provided earlier in the meeting

Sewer - 10% reduction in sewer bills due to shared services with Bedminster. Further reduction in sewer charges are expected at the next renewal period. Kudos to the Public Works Department for being proactive in attaining licensing needed to facilitate the shared sewer service agreement.

Property - nothing additional

Fire - Kudos to the Police, Fire Department and Rescue squad for their hard work.

Police – Distracted Driver Grant produced 105 summonses in 99 hours of work over a 21 day period. A total of 238 summonses were written for all violations in that time period. E-ticketing has been implemented and patrol cars have mobile data computers which link to the court system. When a ticket is written it is instantaneously received by the court and at the state level.

Mayor – Mayor Muller visited Bernards High School for a Board of Education meeting. The meeting was held in the new media center. The media center is constructed in the old auditorium at Bernards High School. It includes small classrooms, a language lab and state-of-the-art teaching software and hardware. Money well spent!

John Sweeney, Farm Cottage Road, stated that, in his opinion, a monetary figure should be set for the Liberty Park project in order to prevent repeating past mistakes with large projects. Referring back to the past library renovation plan in the mid 2000's, he informed the Council that there was no dollar figure assigned to the project. As a result, professional fees spiraled out of control and the work was never done.

Ron Hill, Old Chester Road, recommended that the Park project not be done in phases as it took 35 years to complete the renovation to the firehouse, while the plans were updated every 5 years.

CALENDAR YEAR 2017 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to .5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Peapack and Gladstone in the County of Somerset finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2017 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$137,045 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Peapack and Gladstone in the County of Somerset, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2017 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Peapack and Gladstone shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$159,886, and that the CY 2017 municipal budget for the Borough of Peapack and Gladstone be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.


